

ABOUT THE COVER IMAGE

The image depicts *Bayanihan*, a common tradition in Philippine towns where community members volunteer to help a family move to a new place by volunteering to transport the house (bahay-kubo) to a specific location. The process involves literally carrying the house to its new location. This is done by putting bamboo poles forming a strong frame to lift the stilts from the ground and carrying the whole house with the men positioned at the ends of each pole. *Bayanihan* spirit is also best embodied in Free and Open Software more specifically Koha ILS. Within the Koha ILS community, every individual (either as developer, documentation manager or just plain user that reports bug) works toward a goal of making Koha ILS the best library automation package. The zeroes and ones (binary) that can be seen in the background is a repetition of the word "Koha" represented in binary digits, which is the smallest unit of data on a computer. The binary digits are in colors blue and red, which represent the blue and red horizontal stripes in the Philippine flag. Below the Koha ILS logo is Koha written in ancient Filipino script *bay-bayin*. This has a motif of yellow which depicts the third color in the Philippine flag.

ABOUT THE EVENT

The Association of Special Libraries of the Philippines in cooperation with Koha Integrated Library System (ILS) volunteers is organizing the 2017 Koha International Conference (KohaCon) in the central business district of Makati City, Philippines from June 19 to 23, 2017 (June 19—21 Main Conference at Ayala Museum; June 22-23 Hackfest at Asian Institute of Management).

KohaCon is an annual gathering of Koha Integrated Library System users around the world. Koha is the world's first free and open source ILS, created by the Katipo Communications for the Horowhenua Library Trust in New Zealand. The main purposes of KohaCon are sharing and exchanging experience in new functionalities, training and bug squashing, promoting collaboration to enhance the use of open source integrated library system, and to encourage new developments in Koha. The conference combines high-quality plenary presentations, case studies and round table sessions, a hackfest during the last two days of the conference, and social events. It is held in various countries and as a rule, it shall not be held in the same continent within three years unless no proposal has been introduced from a different continent. Previous KohaCons were held in: Paris, France (2006); Plano, Texas (2009); Wellington, New Zealand (2010); Thane, India (2011); Edinburgh, Scotland (2012); Reno, Nevada (2013); Cordoba, Argentina (2014); Ibadan, Nigeria (2015) and Thessaloniki, Greece (2016).

- 2) KohaCon2017 is a *free Conference* hence *you will be responsible for the entire cost of your travel, accommodation, food and incidental expenses incurred* in attending and/or presenting at the conference.
- 3) No food will be served during the event, including coffee/drinks. Lunch break is set to 1 hour and 30 minutes so you can have time to look for restaurants and take your lunch.
- 4) Food, drinks and smoking are prohibited in the Conference hall.
- 5) Please observe cleanliness at all times.
- 6) Prohibited materials, such as deadly weapons, incendiary or prohibited drugs are to be confiscated without prejudice to legal sanctions.
- 7) Disorderly and unbecoming behavior of any kind is strongly discouraged.
- 8) Guests who are intoxicated from alcohol or any prohibited substance shall not be allowed within the Museum premises.
- 9) There is designated for each presentations, speakers are encouraged to abide on the time limit.

Koha Community Code of Conduct

All delegates, speakers, sponsors and volunteers at any Koha event are required to agree with the following code of conduct. Organisers will enforce this code throughout the event.

The Quick Version

Koha event organisers are dedicated to providing a harassment-free experience for everyone, regardless of gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, body size, race, or religion. We do not tolerate harassment of event participants in any form. Sexual language and imagery is not appropriate for any event venue, including talks. Event participants violating these rules may be sanctioned or expelled from the event without a refund at the discretion of the event organisers.

Harassment includes, but is not limited to:

- •Violent threats, intimidation or personal insults directed against another person
- •Verbal, graphic or written comments related to gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, body size, race or religion
- Posting sexually explicit or violent material
- •Stalking or following, including harassing photography or recording
- •Sustained disruption of talks or other presentations
- •Inappropriate physical contact or sexual attention
- •Posting (or threatening to post) other people's personally identifying information
- Advocating for, or encouraging, any of the above behavior

Repeated harassment of others. In general, if someone asks you to stop, then stop.

The Less Quick Version

Participants asked to stop any harassing behavior are expected to comply immediately. Sponsors are also subject to the anti-harassment policy. In particular, sponsors should not use sexualized images, activities, or other material. Booth staff (including volunteers) should not use sexualized clothing/uniforms/costumes, or otherwise create a sexualized environment.

If a participant engages in harassing behavior, event organisers retain the right to take any actions to keep the event a welcoming environment for all participants. Event organisers may take action to redress anything designed to, or with the clear impact of, disrupting the event or making the environment hostile for any participants.

Abstract

Keys Objectives This study tries to achieve some keys objectives and to enumerate the experience of the University of Agriculture Peshawar Library in the implementation of Koha ILS. The study will also identify some elements towards sufficient utilization of ILS and will be examine challenges and prospects to the implementation of the Koha ILS. The study will explain strategies towards migration of data from INMAGIC to Koha and will suggest strategies for successful implementation of Koha.

Methodology

The paper describes the author's practical experiences regarding implementation of the Koha open-source ILS. The data was migrated from INMAGIC to Koha through marc edit software. The installation was done through command line of the koha system RFID was integrated with koha through another custom built software. The 150000 records of books and 3500 patrons were migrated from the INMAGIC to Koha.

Major findings

The main finding of this paper is: Koha is an international standard open source software and has those functionalities which can fulfill the library automation need of the all kind of libraries. Other librarians can easily implement Koha in their libraries. The data conversion of INMAGIC to Koha will be help other librarian to implement Koha in their libraries. Integration with RFID is now easy for those who already use Koha in their libraries.

Implication\$/Conclu\$ion\$

This paper will help librarians to implement Koha in a practical way to their libraries. The author implemented Koha at the AUP Library within six months, and the author used migrated data from Computerized Documentation System/Integrated Set of Information System to MARC-21 for books. This practice will influence librarians to learn Koha and implement it in their libraries.

Perceived Impact on the Adoption of Koha on the State University Library's Management System

Abubakar S. Mama

Abstract:

The study was conducted primarily to describe the adoption of the Koha Integrated Library System in a state university library. This study used the descriptive-correlation type of research utilizing frequency, percentage, standard deviation, and weighted mean to determine the responses of the participants. The Spearman's Rho correlation coefficient was also used to relate the variables of the study. The study selected the library employees of a state university as the participants of the study. Based on the findings of the study, the participants' level of awareness on the acquisition, cataloguing, circulation, member's registration, and reporting modules of the Koha Integrated Library System was averagely described as high. Moreover, the participants' demonstration of practices relevant to the use of the library system was also described as high. Furthermore, the participants' perceptions of the impact of the use of the Koha Integrated Library System were also high. Finally, the relationship of the variables of the study was determined using the Spearman's Rho correlation coefficient and the finding of the study revealed that the participants' level of awareness and practices on the Koha Integrated Library System are significantly related to the perceived impact of adopting the system. This study points to the need of the university library officials to frequently conduct an in-house awareness program of the functions of the different modules of the Koha Integrated Library System, especially for library systems that are updated to the latest version.

Digitizing Sangguniang Panlalawigan ng Batanga; Ordinance; and Resolutions: Increasing Access to Public Documents Through Koha Alexander T. Lunar

Abstract:

One of the important issues in information retrieval is to provide medium suitable for searching and access. In 2011, by virtue of Provincial Ordinance No. 004, Batangas Provincial Library was placed under the direct supervision of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan pursuant to Republic Act 7160 thus the Office of the Provincial Secretary started to issue a copy of Provincial Ordinances and Resolutions to the library for archival purposes. For years, the collection grown into a large number of public documents thus access and retrieval is of concern. On October, 2012, the Provincial Library avail "Koha" thru the National Library of the Philippines and started using it as its integrated library system. This work explores the organization and digitization of public documents facilitated by Koha for better access and retrieval. It aims to enhance digital research environment and ensure that the full wealth of local resources held by institution be integrated online. This paper also presents the application components of the program and evaluation of its usability.

Bringing AGROVOC terms into Koha ILS

Eugene Jose T. Espinoza

ABSTRACT:

The Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations' David Lubin Memorial Library in Rome, Italy is using the Koha Integrated Library System for its different library processes. The major modules currently used by the library are: 1) Cataloging module, 2) OPAC module, 3) Serials Management module, 4) Authorities module (Koha's default and through Agrovoc search interface customized by PTFS-Europe), 5) Patrons module, and 6) Acquisitions module. In addition to the abovementioned modules, an AGROVOC module was developed by PTFS Europe. This AGROVOC module connects directly to the FAO's AGROVOC thesaurus created by Agricultural Information Management Standards through a web service.

The AGROVOC Thesaurus can be accessed as LOD through its online search and browse, File for Download either as Core (RDF and NT format) or LOD (NT and NQ format), as web service through SOAP, through Public SPARQL endpoint. It is also available in the following formats: SKOS RDF/XML, MySQL, Protégé DB, OWL and ISO2709.

Given limited time to work on the project, the analyst explored various means of getting the AGROVOC terms into a format that can be ingested into the Koha ILS—as MARC format.



Publishing Library Linked Data via Koha and Aliada open source systems

ABSTRACT:

ALIADA, Spanish word that means 'ally', is intended to be a tool to help cultural heritage institutions to automatically publish their high quality data in the Linked Data Cloud. As a non-expert user oriented web application, ALIADA supports the entire cycle of publication of library metadata in the web of data due to its different modules connected in a REST architecture. The integration with the LMS starts with the selection and validation of the MARCXML or DublinCore file exported by KOHA. The conversion of the metadata to RDF is made according the ALIADA ontology, mainly based on FRBRoo ontology for libraries and museums, but also including other ontologies and vocabularies, such as FoaF, SKOS, W3C or WGS84. Resulting RDF triples are linked to the external datasets chosen by the institution (DBpedia, Europeana, LCSH, VIAF...) in a process called Linking, and URIs are generated and saved in the database. The last step in the workflow is the publication of the dataset through a SPARQL endpoint. Since the completion of the project, new opportunities have arisen that require the evolution of the initial approach of ALIADA to meet the current requirements of a more mature community of libraries facing the Linked Data challenge.




LOCATION MAPS




Google map of the Main Conference Venue and nearby establishments


Ayala Museum Ground Floor Lobby Floor Plan



You must then take a left to Salcedo Street, then another left to Benavidez Street.


