Mr. Kunzel - ASLP's New Honorary Member



In the ASLP's 58th General Assembly and Induction Ceremony last January 25, 2012 at the De La Salle University – Makati Extension Campus (25th floor, Tower I, RCBC Plaza, Makati City, Philippines), Mr. Richard Kunzel was welcomed as our new honorary member.

Mr. Kunzel studied Slavic Philology, Theater and South-East European History at Ludwig-Maximilian University Munich, finished with Master examination. He has a diploma in Russian interpreting. Also, Mr. Kunzel is the Director of the Goethe-Institut Philippinen. He has been very supportive to ASLP and to the development of historical research and library development in the country through his various initiatives.

He supported various ASLP activities like:

Paper Conservation and Preservation with Observation Tour of Selected Archival Institutions – Nov 16-18, 2010 – National Lib

He also gave an inspirational message from last year's *57th General Assembly* at the BETP DTI last January 21, 2011.

He also became ASLP's resource person during the 1st NCSLP in Baguio City. The title of his presentation was *Goethe-Institut Philippinen @ 50* last October 19-21, 2011.

Mr. Kunzel supports not only the ASLP but also the National Library. He gave efforts to restore some of the important works of Jose Rizal.

From 27 April to 13 May 2011, two professional conservators from Germany, with the help of the National Library of the Philippines, conducted a restoration and conservation work on Rizal's two novels Noli Me Tangere and El Filibusterismo, and the poem "Mi Ultimo Adios" (Last Farewell). Also part of the preservation work is "Guillermo Tell", Rizal's Tagalog translation of the play "William Tell" by Friedrich Schiller. The project is funded by the Federal Government of Germany (through its Embassy in Manila) as part of its cultural preservation program, and by the National Library of the Philippines. The other project sponsors and proponents are the Goethe Institut-Philippinen, Deutsche Literaturarchiv Marbach and Universität Münster.

It may interest you to know that, as part of the year-long celebration in the Philippines, there was also an exhibit of original Rizal items (the so-called Ullmer collection) last 8-10 June 2011 at the National Library of the Philippines.

We are very much honored for your presence and for finding the time to be with us today.

The past year has been a blissful year for the ASLP. It has opened great opportunities and friendships for the association. Even with the issues and professional competitions surrounding ASLP the past Board was able to pull things through that made ASLP's presence felt not just among local colleagues but as well as with colleagues as far as Japan, India, Vietnam, Singapore and other neighboring countries through the SLA-Asian Chapter and as far as Australia, United States, and of course Germany.

The 2011 activities of the ASLP somehow and in some ways managed to add some income to the association.

The first seminar about **The Challenges and Opportunities of Librarians and Information Professionals in the Age of New Technology** held in Bamboo Garden, Dipolog City on April 27-30, 2012 was in cooperation with the Provincial Library of Zamboanga del Norte headed by Mrs. Erlinda Nunag. It was in a way remarkable because it was the first ever seminar for librarians and library staff to be held there. It gave the ASLP an opportunity to reach out with our colleagues in Mindanao and other nearby provinces and cities.

The ASLP had also the **ASLP on the Go: Tour of International Cultural Center Libraries**, **Museums and Archives in Metro Manila** on July 14 & 15, 2011. The institutions visited were:

During the 32nd Manila International Book Fair held on September 15, 2011 at SMX Convention Center, Pasay City, the ASLP had a forum on **Web Safety & Security**. Mr. Severo "Sonnie" Santos an advocate of "web safety for parents" was the resource person. It was also well attended by colleagues and students.

The **1st National Congress of Special Libraries of the Philippines (1st NCSLP)** on *Moving Forward: Managing Libraries and Information Centers in a Fast Changing Environment* on October 19-

21, 2011 at Hotel Supreme Convention Plaza, Baguio City was an aggressive move by the ASLP to pull through. But I should say that we managed it successfully. The ASLP was able to create links with our colleagues in Japan through Ms. Yoko Sawada, the Deputy Director of IDE Library and U.S.A. through Ms. Xin Li the Associate University Librarian of the Cornell University. Of course Dir. Richard Künzel of the Goethe Institut Philippinen, Mr. Ambeth Ocampo of the Ateneo de Manila University, and Dir. Milagros Ong of the Supreme Court were among the experts who were the resource persons during the 1st NCSLP. The ASLP was also very much grateful for Mayor Mauricio Dumugan, the Mayor of Baguio City and Counselor Robin Diallo, Foreign Affairs Officer of the US Embassy Manila for gracing the said event.

The last activity was an **Out & Reach at the Crater of Mt. Pinatubo**, a partnership with the Philippine Association of Academic and Research Librarians (PAARL) last December 3, 2011.

Over all, these are what the ASLP has achieved in the past year:

1) The first major seminar, ever held in Dipolog City – It was an aggressive move by the ASLP to bring this event in a place where the surrounding neighboring municipalities were infiltrated with people in conflict with the government. It was a move to reach out with colleagues in those areas.

2) Library tour which created linkages and familiarity with colleagues in visited institutions.

3) The forum on "Web Safety & Security" was well attended by colleagues and students.

4) The 1st National Congress of Special Libraries of the Philippines (NCSLP) – It was intended to create opportunity for colleagues from different special libraries and the like to meet, network, and exchange ideas and library resources.

5) Out and reach at the crater of the Mt. Pinatubo, a partnership with PAARL.

6) Increase in membership – Through the effort of all the officers and most especially through the diligence of Mr. Joseph Yap, our PRO then, a remarkable increase in membership was attained.

7) ASLP Wikipedia – Aside from ASLP's Facebook account, the ASLP was able to come up with its own Wikipedia to make all ASLP's activities available online. Again, this was realized through the technical know-how of Mr. Joseph Yap.

8) ISSN for ASLP newsletter – The ASLP newsletter has now finally assigned with an ISSN.

9) Three (3) ASLP newsletters were published and disseminated, and now available at http://aslpwiki.wikispaces.com/

10) ASLP video lunched during the 1st NCSLP

- 11) The ASLP was invited to two (2) tourisms events:
 - a. M.I.C.E.CON 2011 in Cebu City
 - b. IT&CMA 2011 in Thailand

Above all, the ASLP was able to create friendships and cooperation not just to our members and colleagues here in the Philippines but as well as with colleagues abroad. Through such friendships and cooperation, the ASLP is slowly being known abroad. Thus, making opportunities not just for the association but most especially to its members.

Lastly, with all the effort put forth and the events that transpired in the past year, the ASLP will soon embarked in greater opportunities and challenges that may require everyone's support and cooperation.
